

Seasons

Archery	Sept. 15 - Nov. 13 and Nov. 23 - Dec. 31

- Youth, Landowner and Season Choice Antlerless permits allow hunting during all of the seasons listed above, with the appropriate weapon.
- Youths age 16 may hunt with youth deer permits provided they are age 15 when they apply and provided they are not more than 15 on Sept. 15, 2009.

Legal Methods

Firearm Permits:

- Rifles,** 22 caliber or larger that deliver at least 900 foot-pounds of energy at 100 yards.
- Handguns** or muzzleloading handguns that deliver at least 400 foot-pounds of energy at 50 yards.
- Muzzleloading rifles 44 caliber or larger.
- Muzzleloading muskets 62 caliber or larger, firing a single slug.
- Shotguns** of 20 gauge or larger that fire a single slug.
- Archery equipment is not allowed, except crossbows that have a draw weight of 125 pounds or more.

** Semi-automatic firearms capable of holding more than six cartridges are not allowed.

Muzzleloader Permits:

- Muzzleloading rifles, muskets and muzzleloading handguns as defined for firearm permits.

Archery Permits:

- Longbows or compound bows that have a draw weight of 40 pounds or more at or before 28-inch draw.
- Arrows must be released by hand or handheld release. Devices that maintain the bow at full draw or in firing position are prohibited. Crossbows and draw locking devices are permitted only for those who are incapable of drawing a longbow due to a permanent physical impairment.†

†Disabled Persons Permit Provision

Nebraska law allows hunters with certified disabilities to obtain a permit to hunt big game. Such permits must be either-sex permits. This provision does not apply to units with bag restrictions that are 100 percent buck-only or 100 percent antlerless-only. Special application forms may be obtained at one of the Commission's permitting offices and signed by the applicant's physician. Obtain a big game permit first, then call or write the Commission for a disabled application.

Bag Limit

The limit is as stated on the permit.

Shooting Hours

It is legal to shoot 30 minutes before sunrise to 30 minutes after sunset.

Sights

- It is unlawful to use any electrical device to amplify natural light or to project a light beam or image to a target, including night-vision or infrared scopes and laser sights.
- Red-dot and illuminated reticle sights and scopes are permitted.
- Magnifying and variable-power scopes are allowed.

Permit

- A permit or tag is valid only in the area for which it is issued and must be signed by the permittee.
- It is unlawful to borrow a permit or tag or to transfer or loan a permit or tag to another person.

Habitat Stamp

- All residents 16 years of age and older and all nonresidents regardless of age must carry proof of a valid habitat stamp while hunting big game.
- Only one habitat stamp is necessary for all hunting in any calendar year.
- Individuals with valid, fee-exempt permits are not required to purchase a habitat stamp to hunt big game.
- A 2009 habitat stamp is valid for the January season.

Hunting Methods

- It is unlawful to chase, harass, shoot or shoot at any deer from a vehicle or vessel while the vehicle or vessel is moving.
- It is unlawful to shoot from the right-of-way of a public road.
- It is unlawful to carry a firearm on a snowmobile, except when it is unloaded and in a case.
- It is unlawful to hunt from or with a snowmobile.

Get Permission

- Most hunting in Nebraska is done on private land, where permission is required.
- It is unlawful to hunt within 200 yards of an occupied dwelling or feedlot without specific permission for that purpose.

Possession

- Deer taken during this season may not be possessed after Aug. 1, 2012.
- If any portion is given away, it must be accompanied by a statement of such gift, signed by the permit holder, and including the permit number.

Spotlighting

It is unlawful to use a spotlight or other artificial light from a vehicle or vessel while having in possession or control any firearm, crossbow or bow and arrow.

Use of Radio

It is unlawful to use two-way radios or any other electronic devices to transmit information about the location of any game animal or game bird to or from a conveyance of any type (including vehicles, aircraft, boats, snowmobiles, all-terrain vehicles, etc.).

Checking

- Each deer must be delivered by the permit holder to an official check station.
- Archery deer must be checked within 72 hours of the time of kill, but no later than 1 p.m. on Nov. 14 for deer taken during the first portion of the season or 1 p.m. on Jan. 2 for deer taken during the second portion of the archery season.
- Muzzleloader deer must be checked by 1 p.m. on Jan 2.
- Firearm deer must be checked by 1 p.m. on Oct. 13 for deer taken during the October Antlerless firearm season, by 1 p.m. Nov. 23 for deer taken during the November season and by 1 p.m. Jan. 16 for those taken during the January season.
- The carcass may be separated into halves or quarters, provided that evidence of sex is retained on each hind quarter/half. Head and hide must accompany the carcass to the check station.
- The permit and check station seal must be retained while transporting deer to a point of permanent storage or processing.

Baiting

- It is unlawful to take bighorn (mountain) sheep, elk, deer, or antelope within 200 yards of a site upon which feed, feed or mineral supplement, or bait has been placed within the previous 60 days.
- This does not include placement of food or food/mineral supplement in the active operation of husbandry for domesticated livestock other than domesticated cervidae (family that deer belong to).
- It does not prevent the take of animals on or near planted food plots.
- It does not allow adjacent landowners to bait an area and prevent the take of animals on property owned by others.

Tagging

- Immediately after a deer is taken, the hunter must punch or notch his or her permit or tag, showing date taken and sex of the animal.
- Punching/notching the permit or tag automatically cancels the permit or tag.
- The permit must be kept with the hunter and/or the deer at all times.
- When the animal is not with the hunter, the permit or bonus tag must remain with the deer.

Hunter Education

Required for all hunters ages 12 through 29:

- Hunting with either a firearm or crossbow must have on their person proof of successful completion of Firearm Hunter Education.
- Hunting deer, antelope, elk, or bighorn sheep with bow and arrow must carry proof of successful completion of Bowhunter Education.
- Who have not completed a Firearm Hunter and/or

Bowhunter Education course may obtain an Apprentice Hunter Education Exemption Certificate from the Commission.

Apprentice Hunter Education Exemption Certificate

- Apprentice Hunter Education Exemption Certificate provides the novice hunter age 12 and older an opportunity to try hunting and receive training from an experienced hunter before completing Hunter Education.
- A hunter using this certificate must be accompanied* at all times while hunting.
- This certificate may be obtained once in each person's lifetime, expires on Dec. 31 and may be renewed once.
- The fee is \$5.

*Accompanied is defined as: in the presence of a licensed "experienced" hunter age 19 or older. There may be no more than two hunters using the certificate accompanied by the "experienced" hunter at any time and the "experienced" hunter must at all times be in unaided visual and verbal communication with the child under age 12 and/or the "apprentice" hunter ages 12 through 29.

Hunter Orange

- Any person, except archers, hunting antelope, elk, bighorn sheep, or deer during an authorized firearm season must display on his or her head, chest and back at least 400 square inches of hunter orange material.
- An exception is that hunter orange is required for any deer hunter, including an archer, within Season Choice Areas 18 and 21 during the October Antlerless season.

Sale of Parts

- It is lawful to sell the hide, hair, hooves, bones and antlers of any deer which is taken legally.
- The sale or purchase of deer meat is unlawful.

Hunting of Other Wildlife

- During the November firearm deer season, only hunters with a valid unfilled deer permit may hunt wildlife other than deer with centerfire rifles or centerfire handguns, provided they are hunting in the deer management unit for which their deer permit is valid.
- Fall turkey permit holders – wearing the required hunter orange – may hunt turkeys, with legal shotguns or archery weapons, during the November firearm deer season.

Shooting Hours

It is legal to shoot 30 minutes before sunrise to 30 minutes after sunset.

Hunter Education

Required for all hunters ages 12 through 29: 1) hunting with either a firearm or crossbow must have on their person proof of successful completion of Firearm Hunter Education; 2) hunting deer, antelope, elk, or bighorn sheep with bow and arrow must carry proof of successful completion of Bowhunter Education; 3) who have not completed a Firearm Hunter and/or Bowhunter Education course may obtain an Apprentice Hunter Education Exemption Certificate from the Commission.

Apprentice Hunter Education Exemption Certificate

This certificate provides the novice hunter age 12 and older an opportunity to try hunting and receive training from an experienced hunter before completing Hunter Education. A hunter using this certificate must be accompanied* at all times while hunting. This certificate may be obtained once in each person's lifetime, expires on Dec. 31 and may be renewed once. The fee is \$5.

*Accompanied is defined as: in the presence of a licensed "experienced" hunter age 19 or older. There may be no more than two hunters using the certificate accompanied by the "experienced" hunter at any time and the "experienced" hunter must at all times be in unaided visual and verbal communication with the child under age 12 and/or the "apprentice" hunter ages 12 through 29.

Tagging

Immediately after a deer is taken, the hunter must punch or notch his or her permit or tag, showing date taken and sex of the animal. Punching/notching the permit or tag automatically cancels the permit or tag. The permit must be kept with the hunter and/or the deer at all times. When the animal is not with the hunter, the permit or bonus tag must remain with the deer.

Habitat Stamp

All residents 16 years of age and older and all nonresidents regardless of age must carry proof of a valid habitat stamp while hunting big game. Only one habitat stamp is necessary for all hunting in any calendar year. Individuals with valid, fee-exempt permits are not required to purchase a habitat stamp to hunt big game. A 2009 habitat stamp is valid for the January season.

Permit

A permit or tag is valid only in the area for which it is issued and must be signed by the permittee. It is unlawful to borrow a permit or tag or to transfer or loan a permit or tag to another person.

Hunter Orange

Any person, except archers, hunting antelope, elk, bighorn sheep, or deer during an authorized firearm season must display on his or her head, chest and back at least 400 square inches of hunter orange material.

Sale of Parts

It is lawful to sell the hide, hair, hooves, bones and antlers of any deer which is taken legally. The sale or purchase of deer meat is unlawful.

Possession

Deer taken during this season may not be possessed after Aug. 1, 2012. If any portion is given away, it must be accompanied by a statement of such gift, signed by the permit holder, and including the permit number

Use of Radio

It is unlawful to use two-way radios or any other electronic devices to transmit information about the location of any game animal or game bird to or from a conveyance of any type (including vehicles, aircraft, boats, snowmobiles, all-terrain vehicles, etc.).

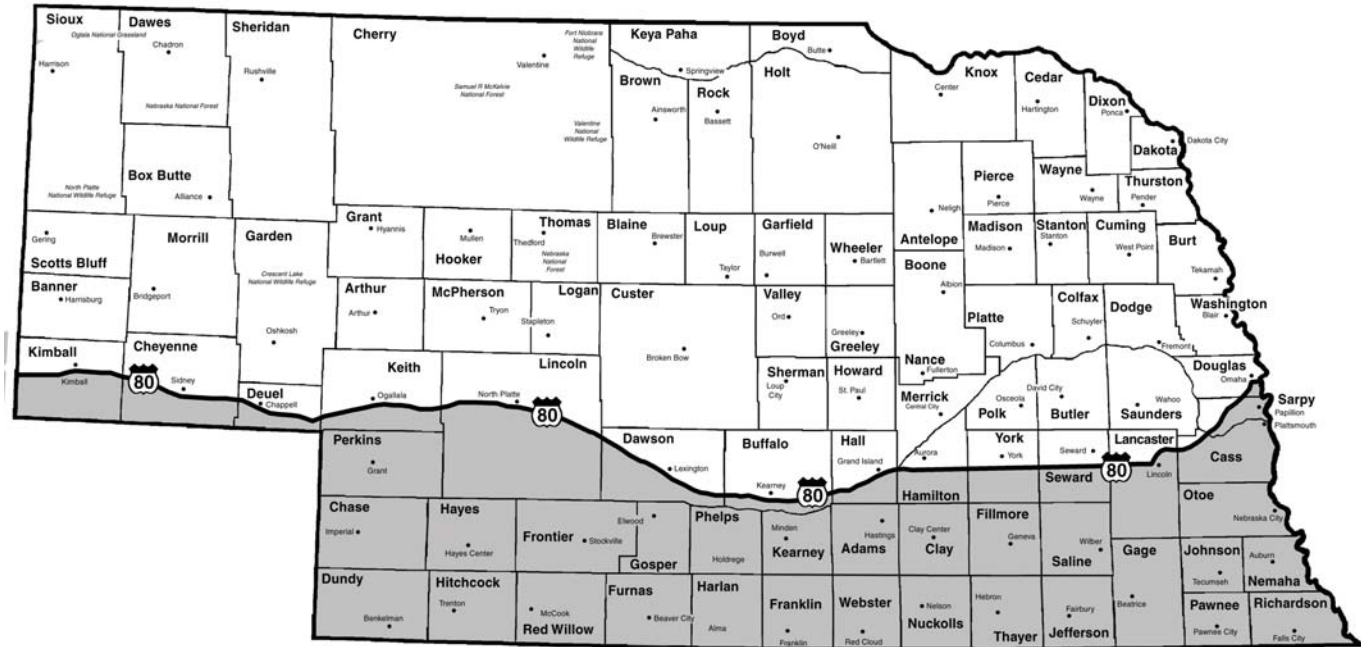
Baiting

It is unlawful to take bighorn (mountain) sheep, elk, deer, or antelope within 200 yards of a site upon which feed, feed or mineral supplement, or bait has been placed within the previous 60 days. This does not include placement of food or food/mineral supplement in the active operation of husbandry for domesticated livestock other than domesticated cervidae (family that deer belong to). It does not prevent the take of animals on or near planted food plots. It does not allow adjacent landowners to bait an area and prevent the take of animals on property owned by others.

Checking

Each deer must be delivered by the permit holder to the check station. The deer may be halved or quartered, provided that evidence of sex remains attached on each the half/hind-quarter. Permit and check station seal must be retained while transporting deer to a point of permanent storage or processing.

- You may take your deer to any convenient check station.
- Each permit holder must accompany his or her deer to the check station.
- Read the checking instructions on the regulations sheet to ensure deer are checked on time.
- Check station operators may change the hours listed below. Please call the station to verify hours.

* Nebraska Game and Parks Commission offices are open 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday-Friday, except during the November firearm deer season, when checking hours are 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Offices are closed on holidays. The Ak-Sar-Ben Aquarium is open 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. seven days a week, except during November firearm season, when hours are 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Times apply to Archery, Muzzleloader and January Late Seasons only.
